RECIPIENT OF SERVICE: HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS PROGRAM



ZIVA HARRIS

In the face of adversity, Ziva Harris has shown remarkable strength and resilience. A survivor of the Holocaust, she found herself struggling after the loss of her husband. But in the midst of her hardship, she found a lifeline in JFSA's Holocaust Survivors Program.

Ziva was born during World War II in Czechoslovakia and her parents fled with her to Budapest, Hungary. They were separated by the Nazis and Ziva was left with a couple on a farm. After the war, she was reunited with her parents, but they were strangers to each other and it took years for the family to adjust. They eventually immigrated to Israel and then Ziva immigrated to the US.

When her husband died, Ziva was traumatized and emotionally distraught. Her friends told her about JFSA and she contacted them for help. JFSA helped her complete an application for the Claims Conference and she became a member of the Holocaust Survivors at JFSALV.

JFSA provides Ziva with home care, food from the food pantry, gift cards for food, assistance with completing forms, referrals to other organizations, and social events. They also paid for an air handler in her home when her air conditioning system broke down. Ziva is grateful for the services JFSA provides and says they "look out for me." She especially enjoys the company of her PCA and the social events that JFSA hosts.

Ziva's story is a testament to the transformative power of JFSA's Holocaust Survivors Program. It is a reminder that even in the darkest of times, there is always hope. With the support of generous donors, JFSA is able to provide essential services to Holocaust survivors, ensuring that they are not forgotten.


